

Acetaminophen (Tylenol) Administration Permission Form

_____ may take acetaminophen (Tylenol) at school. Grade: _____

Indiana State Law requires parental permission for your child to take Tylenol at school. Under the standing orders of the school corporation's medical advisor, acetaminophen (generic form of Tylenol) may be given with the Parent/Guardian's authorization. Acetaminophen may be administered by mouth for symptoms such as: toothache, dental discomfort, menstrual cramping, simple headaches, and minor joint pain. Students may not receive acetaminophen for colds and/or chronic pain under the standing order. Complaints such as these will require a written order from the student's primary care physician/healthcare provider.

Acetaminophen will only be given between the hours of 10am & 1pm during the school day. Your child will not be given a dose in excess of the recommended dose on the acetaminophen's packaging without a written physician's order to do so.

Per Standing Order of the Medical Advisor: Only one dose will be administered during the school day up to twice in one school week. IF the student continues to complain of discomfort and request pain relief, the parent/guardian will be contacted by the school nurse regarding concern for the necessity of a medical exam by the physician. A written physician's order will be required if the student is to receive acetaminophen more than twice per week.
